TIMO, or Training In Ministry Outreach is a two and a half year program designed to train future missionaries in the area of cross cultural ministry while actually working with an unreached people group. A TIMO team consists of a group of 6 to 10 new missionaries led by a veteran missionary or missionary couple for the purpose of **LEARNING** and **DOING** missionary outreach. The team lives among an unreached or partially unreached people group, learning their language and culture and allowing God to provide ways of sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ with them. This is accomplished by using a study curriculum designed to work through a logical progression for church planting. The ultimate goal is to actually plant and establish a working and ministering church. Each team is unique in how they approach their outreach, but all hold to 12 Core Values.

The San are the oldest inhabitants of Southern Africa. They are renowned for their survival and hunting skills and rich cultural traditions. They have a vast knowledge of flora that they use for nutritional and medicinal purposes. Colonialism and settling of Bantu tribes throughout Southern Africa have largely destroyed their migratory way of life. Governments have forced the San to relocate to permanent locations usually with the intention of 'civilizing' them and providing schooling, running water and other modern amenities. The San struggle to prove that land belongs to them because they have no concept of private ownership and have no traditional tribal leader which makes it difficult to present their grievances with one strong voice. Unfortunately, their recent history has been one of poverty and social rejection, as well as decline of cultural identity and the discrimination of their rights as a group. Most live at the very bottom of the social scale. Their loss of identity has contributed to low selfesteem, apathy, promiscuity, and alcoholism, particularly amongst the youth. The San are considered the least of the least in Namibia, but in God's eyes they are of great value.
