We have a dear friend who asks, why are we still sending missionaries to Africa? Shouldn't the job be done after more than 100 years?



Africa is a huge continent with 54 countries, 1.1 billion people, 3746 people groups, and over 2000 languages. You can fit the United States, all of Europe, China, India, and Japan into Africa.

According to Africa Inland Mission who serves in 20 of the countries in Africa, there are still 1146 unreached people groups. Of those people groups, 723 people are unengaged, 423 are engaged, and only 51 are engaged by AIM.

What is an unreached people group?

An unreached people group refers to an ethnic group without an indigenous, self-propagating Christian church movement and usually under 2% of population are Christian.

What is the difference between engaged and unengaged?

Unengaged means there is no church planting strategy under way. Engaged means there is commitment to long-term ministry to work in the local language and culture with a church planting strategy under way.

Africa Inland Mission is dedicated to the establishment of Christ-centered churches among all African peoples. Our priority is Africa's unreached.

The San are the least of the least in Namibia and are considered an unreached people group because there is no self-propagating church among them. Yes, there are a few Christians but unable to disciple others. The majority live without any kind of HOPE for today or the future.

There is still much to be done!

Africa is still the poorest and most underdeveloped continent.

We considered it a **privilege to go, live** and serve among the San.
